The 2022 growing season began with a mild winter, bringing 10 inches of rain. Spring and summer temperatures adhered to historical, coastal-influenced norms, setting the stage for a promising harvest. A twist occurred as Labor Day approached, as the forecast signaled an imminent heatwave. After enduring seven days above 100°, relief abounded as the vineyard demonstrated remarkable resilience, affirming the site's pedigree.

The 2022 Estate Selection is a vibrant and aromatic offering with enticing aromas of ripe strawberries and rich espresso. The wine unfolds with remarkable energy on the palate, revealing savory black olive nuances. A subtle mineral texture enhances its elegance, showcasing a harmonious balance and delicate power.

98 PTS A more Medoc-like blend based on 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Cabernet Franc, and 5% Petit Verdot, the 2022 Estate Selection comes from a gravelly bench portion of their estate vineyard and was aged in 50% new French oak and 50% once-used barrels. Deep purple/plum-hued and opaque, it shows sensational aromatics of crème de cassis, flowers, violets, spicy wood, and lead pencil. I absolutely love its overall purity and vibrancy, and it's medium to full-bodied, with a seamless, layered, pure mouthfeel, ultra-fine tannins, and flawless balance. It's a straight-up sensational Bordeaux blend from this estate that shows what's possible with these varieties in Santa Barbara County. Drink bottles over the coming two decades or more. 95 PTS The 2022 Estate Selection is a classically built wine with great elegance and freshness, all in a deceivingly soft-stepping package. Ultra-fine tannins lend structure to the rich, dark-fruited base layer, while underbrush, iodine, black fruit and savory herbs add further complexity.
